The Students Union is run by an elected Executive Committee made up of:

President – The Role

- Official Spokesperson of the Student Union
- Encourage South West College students to join and get involved in their Student Union
- Chair all Student Union Meetings

Vice-President – The Role

- Act on the Student President's behalf in their absence
- Assist with the publicity on all matters relevant to the Student Union

Secretary – The Role

- Responsible for convening and advertising all Student Union meetings
- Record and circulate the minutes of all meetings.

Treasury (In Name Only) – The Role

- Ensure that all financial transactions are legitimate and that all necessary paper work and receipts are kept for all transactions.

Welfare Officer – The Role:

- Promote student welfare rights
- Establish, maintain contact and provide information from groups and organisations that work on welfare issues.

Public Relations Officer – The Role

- Publicise the Student Union via various means of communication with the approval of the Executive
- Co-ordinate e-mail and internet communication
- Liaise with South West College Marketing Team in relation to press releases and publicity materials.

Disability Officer

- To campaign for the rights of disabled students
- To promote disability awareness throughout South West College
- To liaise with South West College Equality Group in relation to access and disability issues
