# how to enrol



## Enrolments begin in all Campuses on Monday 25th July 2011.

On equality grounds this enrolment notice will be advertised in all local newspapers prior to this date. Enrolling on a course at South West College can be done by choosing from one of the 3 methods detailed:

### 1. By Telephone

A recorded message will ask you to select from one of the following options:

### 2. By Post

You can enrol by post until 30.09.11 for all courses.

Simply complete the enrolment form enclosed and post it to the relevant College Campus (addresses available at the back of this prospectus), enclosing payment for the course. Postal enrolment will require payment by cheque, credit card, debit card or postal order.

### 3. In Person

You can call into the College during opening hours.

It is important to note that enrolments are accepted on a 'first come first served' basis and many courses fill up quickly.

#### PLEASE NOTE

Enrolment may be taken after the main enrolment period only if places are still available.

#### AGE LIMIT

Students must be 16 years of age on or before 1st July 2011 to enrol on any of the courses in the South West College.

#### ALL APPLICANTS WELCOME

The College welcomes applications from mature students, students with qualifications from other countries and those seeking to gain qualifications. The standard entry requirement for many courses may be waived if alternative qualifications or experience can be offered. # financial information

## Financial Guide to Fees for Further Education Students

1. Course Fees are listed in the course timetable provided.

2. **Payment** – Course fees MUST be paid before the first session of the course and can be made by Cash, Credit Card, Debit Card, Cheque, Postal Order or specific cases by direct debit.

### HAVING DIFFICULTY PAYING FEES?

Hardship Funds may be available to assist students (with travel, course materials and other expenses) who are experiencing financial hardship. In order to qualify for Hardship Funds you must be over 18 and enrolled as a student of the College. For further financial details and an application form (forms available from mid September 2011), please contact Student Services at the relevant Campus for further information.

### 3. Further Education Tuition Fees

Students paying FE tuition fees less than £150 – Full payment must be made at time of enrolment.

#### Further Education Fees by Direct Debit

Students paying FE tuition fees of £150 or more can pay in 4 equal instalments: with the first instalment due at the time of enrolment, in the form of Cash, Cheque or Credit/Debit Card and the balance due in 3 further instalments to be collected by direct debit on 25 November 2011, 27 January 2012, and 30 March 2012

### ELB Grants

Some students may be entitled to the ELB grant which has a maximum value of £465.00. These students must apply for the grant through the Education and Library Board and must pay the College the relevant tuition fee by 4 equal instalments as above. If the student is awarded the grant, the College will invoice the Board for the amount allocated and a refund will be generated to the student on receipt of a copy of the letter stating the confirmation from the ELB.

### Additional Costs

Many courses have additional costs embedded in the total cost e.g. exams fees, registration with or membership of professional bodies, course materials (e.g. beauty/hairdressing kits, computer discs, art materials, flowers) and/or books etc. This information is as accurate as possible at the time of going to press but may be subject to change as these costs are outside the College's control.

### 4. Courses that last for more than one year

Fees payable at enrolment apply to year 1 only. Candidates must re-enrol and pay relevant fees for any further year(s) of study at the start of each academic year.

### 5. Payment of Fees by Employer/Sponsor

If your employer is paying your course and/or exam fees, a letter from your employer or a completed SWC Employer Fee Confirmation Form must accompany your enrolment form, stating their commitment to pay such fees and giving a

name and address for invoicing purposes.

### 6. Please Note

Tuition fees are advertised on a yearly basis for courses of two or more years duration.

### Refunds Policy

Once the appropriate fees have been paid and a student has been accepted on a course normally a refund will not be issued unless the course is cancelled by the College. The following exceptions shall apply:

### Exceptions:

- When a student is prevented by a serious medical condition from attending a course and as a result will be unable to resume studies in a future academic period, then if this can be verified by a doctor's certificate, a refund will be considered.
- If, due to unforeseen personal circumstances, a student is unable to complete their current course of study they may be permitted to transfer their enrolment to the next appropriate academic period. Alternatively, the College will consider issuing a credit note, which may be used for future enrolments within the College.

An administration fee of £20 will be charged per refund generated.

(\* All requests for refunds should be made in writing and sent to the Admissions Office of the relevant Campus for consideration.)

## Reduced Fees

A standard 50% reduction in fees will be allowed to students participating on selected vocational courses that meet residency requirements and fall into any of the following categories. Evidence required is given against each category below: **Please note: Evidence must be produced at the time of enrolment only to enable reduction in fees.**

Essential Skills learners and staff from South West College recently won prestigious awards at this year's Essential Skills Awards ceremony at Hillsborough Castle. The ceremony is designed to recognise and celebrate outstanding achievements in literacy, numeracy and ICT learning for students from all across Northern Ireland.

Nessa Skeffington, Essential Skills Coordinator/Lecturer from Dungannon Campus was crowned Essential Skills Champion for 2011 in recognition of her outstanding contribution to the Essential Skills agenda.

Leo Naan from Enniskillen and Mary McElroy from Roslea were announced as joint winners of the Co Fermanagh Essential Skills Learner of the Year 2011 title and Robert Thompson, also from Enniskillen was presented with the NI Trade Union Essential Skills Learner of the Year 2011.

Like many people, Leo realised that Essential Skills were necessary if he wished to progress his career as a plasterer. After regularly missing out on job vacancies due to his skills gap, Leo embarked on a course of study at South West College in Enniskillen which resulted in Level 2 qualifications in Literacy and Numeracy. Leo, now equipped with these skills, hopes to start his own

plastering business. In addition, he aims to pass on his skills by becoming a part-time plastering instructor. Not only that, Leo is now able to play a fuller part in family life by getting involved with his daughter's schoolwork.

Commenting on his learning experience, Leo said: "I heard about the free Essential Skills classes and how they could help people to improve their chances in life. My

qualifications mean I don't feel excluded and now I have a whole new outlook and ambition in life."

Congratulating Leo, Employment and Learning Minister, Danny Kennedy, said: "Leo's achievements prove the real value of Essential Skills, whether at work or at home and I hope that his story provides the inspiration for others to follow his example. He is a worthy winner of his award."

Mother of five, Mary McElroy's contract of employment was due to end. In order to reapply for the post, Mary knew she had to improve her skills and qualifications. Having gained Essential Skills Level 2 Literacy and Numeracy at South West College in Enniskillen, Mary not only hopes to continue in her employment as a Learner Support Worker but has a number of other ideas for her future – these include setting up a home based knitting business, writing articles for women's magazines and perhaps even writing her autobiography.

Commenting on her Essential Skills experience, Mary said: "I'm thrilled that I have achieved up-to-date qualifications. I'm more confident and can apply my





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communication skills to everyday personal and work situations."

Congratulating Mary on her award, the Minister, Danny Kennedy, said: "Mary has gained new skills which will undoubtedly enhance her career prospects and this is a lesson for us all as we seek to upskill our workforce. An Essential Skills Award is fitting reward for her efforts."

## Highlight 1 Embedding Technicians Scheme

South West College and the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE) are now working together as part of a major programme to boost potential employment prospects for students seeking careers in engineering. Astronauts onboard the International Space Station swapped space walks for careers talks as they teamed up with high-flying students at South West College in Enniskillen recently. A group of six specialists on the high-tech satellite, which is orbiting 220 miles above Earth, took time from complex space operations to encourage learners to aim high and fulfil career ambitions.

During the rare radio contact, participants had a chance to put questions directly to the Station Commander and Flight Engineers in real time and hear how they gained senior positions in space exploration. Mamraz Nagi, Careers Officer at South West College, said he hoped the exciting link up would inspire students to keep pursuing their career goals.

"This project has been about flaring imaginations and showing that ambition and determination can bring extraordinary results. It's not every day that students have the chance to speak with people whose work is literally out of this world," he said. "The fact is that competition for jobs is getting



tougher and for anyone starting out in their chosen field it is critical to stay motivated and focused on achieving their goals. Even astronauts have had to combine hard graft with natural talent to clinch their roles."

The rare opportunity followed more than six months of careful planning and collaboration between South West College, NASA and Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS).

**Highlight 11**  
**£2.4million employability programme to assist NEETs**

The Minister of Employment and Learning, Dr. Stephen Farry launched a new £2.4million employability programme at Stormont in late June 2011. The programme, entitled Step-up to Sustainable Employment (SUSE) is aimed at young people not in employment, education or training (NEETs) and disadvantaged adults. The project will be funded by up to £2.4 million by the European Social Fund Programme 2007-13 administered by the Department for Employment and Learning. Speaking at the project launch in Parliament Buildings, the Minister said: "This project aims to provide support for up to 400 young

people and adults at risk of social exclusion and offers new ways to connect with learning, training and work opportunities. "Projects like SUSE are important and good news for everyone. They benefit individual participants through the promotion of employability and social participation, and help to promote wider economic development. The active involvement of businesses and employers ensures the programme can be shaped to meet specific industry needs and establish valuable work experience and placement programmes."

The Minister praised the project's collaborative approach which will be led by the South West College in partnership with the PSNI, Prince's Trust, Federation of Small Businesses and Northern Ireland Centre for Trauma & Transformation. The Minister emphasised that the Department continues to move provision forward for key inactive groups including young people who are not in education, employment or training, and adults at a disadvantage in the labour market.

Operating across the Cookstown, Dungannon, Omagh, Enniskillen and Strabane areas, the SUSE project will provide confidential one-to-one mentoring and access to a suite of practical courses, support and work experience with local employers.

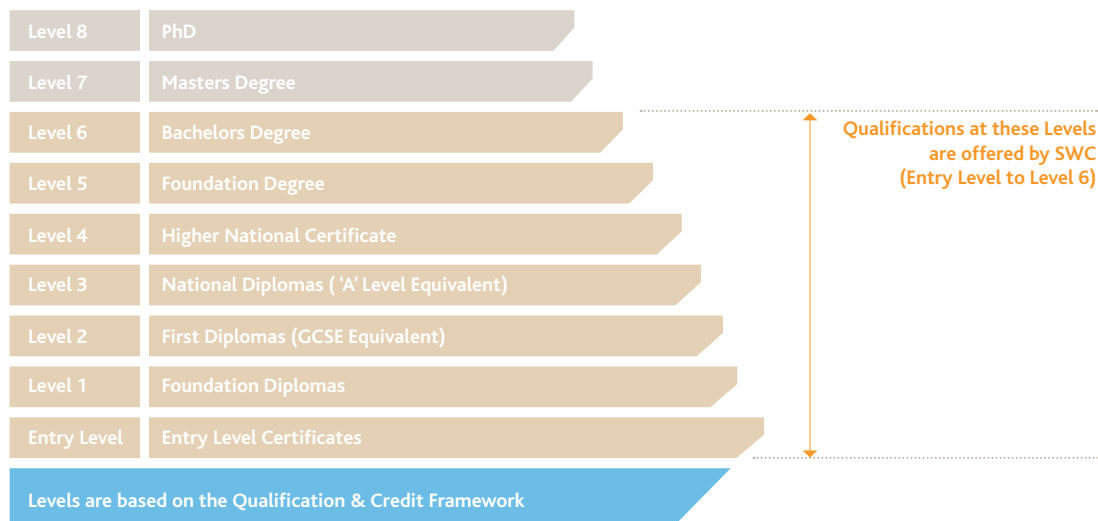

## Accreditation of Prior Experiential Learning (APEL)

South West College operates an Accreditation of Prior Experiential Learning (APEL) process to acknowledge unaccredited learning experiences. APEL is a process through which the learning students have gained from experience can be counted. This process relates to prior learning which has been done by students which has not already been formally assessed. This includes prior learning gained through community-based learning, workplace learning and training, continuing professional development and independent learning.

### APEL can help students to:

- Get a place on an appropriate Foundation Degree at a college if you don't have the normal entry qualifications but can show that you have the necessary knowledge, skills and understanding.
- Gain credit towards modules of a Foundation Degree so as to shorten the normal period of learning by showing that you already have the knowledge, skills and understanding needed for particular parts of the programme or qualification (e.g. units or modules).

### Who is APEL for?

- Individuals in the workplace looking for recognised credit for entry to an academic programme at higher education level.
- Learners who may have exited a higher education programme prior to completion or the receipt of credit and who wish to count that learning towards another award.
- Learners who wish to 'top-up' an existing qualification.
